BIRDS OF GREEN RIVER RESERVOIR STATE PARK

The signature birds of Green River are the breeding Common Loons, whose calls are heard through the summer; the Barred Owl, whose deep "who cooks for you all" calls are heard nightly; and the minstrels of the thrush family, the Veery, Wood Thrush, Swainson's Thrush, and Hermit Thrush.

- Learn to identify the common birds of GRRSP by sight or sound. The Cornell University website All About Birds and many phone apps include calls and songs of birds found at the reservoir.
- Start simple by learning the characteristics of a bird or bird group (ex. beak and body shape and size, color patterns, behavior, and habitat).
- 3. To view birds from a safe distance, purchase or borrow a pair of binoculars. The standard size birding binoculars are 6x32 or 7x32.

The GRRSP Birding List comprises the species that are often observed at the Park in the summer and those that regularly nest at the Park as well.
